This test will have 3 parts.

- 3. The examiner will give you a topic card. You will tell your opinion about the topic.


You now have 10 minutes to prepare your story. Somebody will take you to the test room when it is your turn.



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Part I: Lead-in and Interview

The interlocutor will ask the candidate one introductory question and then two questions on another topic. Topics include travel, work, family, sport, cinema, hobbies, education, relationships and housing.



Part 2: Picture Story

The candidate receives a picture story with an opening line; the task is to tell the story. Before meeting the examiner, the candidate has had ten minutes to prepare. The candidate may make notes in the preparation stage but should not read aloud from a prepared script.

In this part of the test, you are going to tell your story. Lara, here are the pictures and your notes. You can use your notes but please do not read from them. Remember, you only have **1.5 minutes**. You have thirty seconds to look through your notes. Please start when you are ready.



Winter started and the children were very happy to see the first snow...






The candidate tells his/her picture story.
