Part 2: Picture Story

The candidate receives a picture story with an opening line; the task is to tell the story. Before meeting the examiner, the candidate has had ten minutes to prepare. The candidate may make notes in the preparation stage but should not read aloud from a prepared script.

In this part of the test, you are going to tell the story you prepared earlier. Lara, here are the pictures and your notes. Now, I'd like you to tell your story. You may look at your notes but please do not read aloud from them. Tell the story to everybody here. Remember you only have **2 minutes**. You have thirty seconds to look through the pictures and your notes. Please start now.

The candidate receives a topic card with a question a question that can be approached from different angles. The candidate gives his/her opinion about the topic, the interlocutor only listens.

For the final part of the test, you are going to talk about a topic I will give you. Imagine that you are discussing the topic Learning and education with your class. You have **2 minutes** to talk about the advantages and disadvantages. I'm just going to listen.
